In June when things were looking better and we offered in -person participation for the Fathers' Day brunch, folks were still very cautious and most drove through to pick up the food, which I think is a good thing.

We did have a couple of in-person services, one on June 6th, another on July 4<sup>th</sup>, and those who attended seemed to really have enjoyed coming together and visiting with each other. However, after the July 4<sup>th</sup> service, the church got notified that one of the attendees got symptoms and a subsequent home test showed positive for the Corona virus.

A follow up PCR test taken a few days later came up negative for Covid but the person's doctor warned that, due to reported symptoms, we must assume the first positive test was accurate and the second negative test indicated the person had recovered. This also means the virus was active at the July 4<sup>th</sup> service even though symptoms were not apparent yet.

We have asked the July 4th attendees to self-monitor for symptoms and so far have not had any reported incidence of infection. We are grateful the infected person was opened and timely in sharing the information so we were able to take proper precautions.

As result of this "scare" and the rise of infection rate with the recurrence of the mask mandate in California, the church council is pushing the reopening to the first Sunday in September at the earliest.

We will try to keep everyone informed as much as possible but the situation is still very fluid and can change with little notice. Let's all be diligent in keeping ourselves and each other safe.
